

## **NWACC Shine and Show Judges Briefing Sheet**

Please judge all of the cars in each class as consistently as you can. Cars in this class are considered to be “daily drivers” and should be judged on cleanliness and condition or “curb appeal” (i.e. general overall appearance). **They must not be picked apart for small imperfections or non-stock items.** Two judges shall work as a “team” and will judge all cars in a class. The judging team must agree on a score given or the number of points to be deducted for any judged area. DO NOT work independently on separate portions of the car. The judging team should discuss how or why points are to be deducted before entering a score on the judging sheet. Each judge should insure that the other judge remains 3 feet away from the car during the judging process. Please remember this rule as the entrant fully expects the judges to be 3 feet away from the car except as noted on the judging sheet.

You should complete all judging for a car within 5-6 minutes. Do not take a lot of time as it may delay judging of all the cars in the class. The information on the judging sheet must be filled out by the entrant. Pay special attention to the “Odometer Reading” field on the judging sheet. That *must* be filled in as it is a tiebreaker should one be required. If a judging sheet is not filled out, move on to another car and notify the event chairperson that the entrant has not filled out their sheet.

Judges may receive training from either the host club or through an NWACC Competition Committee training session.

When judging cars in this class:

- Judges **MUST NOT** bend over or kneel down to judge any part of car.
- Judges **MUST NOT** place their head inside the vehicle to judge any part of the interior.
- Judges **MUST NOT** touch the car.
- Judges **MUST** remain at least **3 feet** away from any part of the vehicle that is being judged except where the judging sheet specifies.
- Judges **MUST** enter comments regarding each deduction. If there are no comments, the **MAXIMUM** available points for the area shall be awarded regardless of any points shown on the judging sheet.
- Customizing is allowed and is to be judged by the same criteria on the judging sheets. (NOTE: Concours d’ Elegance “Custom” class has been suspended for 2004.)
- Having the hood open for judging is optional and at the discretion of the entrant. If the car has the hood open, judge the engine compartment as shown on the sheet. If the hood is closed, no points are to be awarded.
- Please do not otherwise talk to the owner or entrant while judging. You should refer any questions to the event chair or other person in charge.

### **REMEMBER:**

Please judge all of the cars using the same standards. These cars are “daily drivers” and should be judged on general overall appearance.

**They must not be picked apart for small imperfections or non-stock items!**
