

## **NWACC SHINE AND SHOW GUIDELINES**

### **Section A - General**

1. Cars will be judged by a team of two (2) judges.
2. Every car in a class is to be judged by the same team of judges. However, Judges shall not judge their own cars, nor cars in their class, nor the car of an immediate family member.
3. The judging team must confer and agree upon the point deductions for each area and enter an agreed upon score on the judging sheet. Only one (1) judging sheet is used for each vehicle.
4. Each judging team must be consistent in their values and methods. Shine and Show judges are required to use the "3 Foot Rule" when judging all Shine and Show cars.
5. The entrant must prepare his or her car for judging as specified on the judging sheet. When "Stop Clean" or "Rags Down" is called, entrants must stop any cleaning activities unless something has caused cars in the show field to become contaminated with dust or particles in the air. The Event Chairperson may make a case-by-case decision on cleaning after Stop Clean has been called.
6. All judging teams will be responsible to the Event Chairperson and must be available to meet with the Chairperson in a briefing session prior to judging. The key consideration for the judging teams is an understanding of the score sheets and consistency of judging. The judges should not be influenced by bright colors, frills, or parts or areas of the car that may be dressed up from stock condition. This competition is for cars that may be daily drivers and they must not be picked apart for small imperfections or non-stock items.
7. If more than one car is entered in the same class by the same person, he/she must declare before judging which one is entered for individual championship points.
8. If a tiebreaker is necessary, it shall be the current odometer reading of the car. The car with the highest number of miles displayed on the odometer shall be declared the winner in case of a tie on the judging sheet. It is the entrant's responsibility to fill in the odometer reading on the judging sheet.
9. All cars in a class should be judged under similar conditions.

R10 All cars with less than 10,000 miles or 16,000 kilometers showing on the odometer on the date the Shine-n-Show event is held must be entered in the Under 10K Class. An entrant may choose to enter their car in Concours d' Elegance if desired in lieu of entering the Under 10K Class.

A car entered in the Under 10K Class at any time in the competition year shall remain in this class for the duration of that competition year despite mileage exceeding the 10,000 mile or 16,000 kilometer limit during that competition year.

Any street-driven vehicle, regardless of class, must provide proof of current and valid vehicle registration and proof of liability insurance upon request at the time of registration. A car trailered to an event may be exempt from this requirement.
